## Music:

### Interested in a new item?

If you see an item on this list that you want to check out, be sure to look it up in the library's online catalog to see if it's still available! To access the library's online catalog go to: <http://www.bartowlibrarycatalog.org/>.

1. To do a simple search:
  - Enter your search information in the blank field
  - Select "word or phrase", "author", "title", "subject", "series" or "periodical title" from the drop-down menu
  - Select the library from the drop-down menu if you only want to see the items from a particular branch
  - Click the blue search button and browse the results
2. To do an advanced search:
  - Click the words "power search"
  - Enter your search information in the blank fields
  - Where applicable, select "word or phrase", "author", "title", "subject", "series" or "periodical title" from the drop-down menus beside each blank field
  - If you want to limit your search further, select additional options from the "library", "language", "format", "type", "location" or "item category" drop-down menus
  - Select an option from the "match on" drop-down menu if you want the catalog to search by "keywords", from "left to right", or if you only want "exact content"
  - Enter the publication year under "pubyear" if you only want to see items published during a particular year (or span of years)
  - Select "author", "subject", "title", "relevance", "old to new" or "new to old" from the "sort" drop-down menu to organize the results of your search by one of these options

## Has someone already checked-out the item that you want?

Did you know that you can place a hold on an item so that you're in line to get it?  
To do so:

1. Find the item in the online catalog
2. Click on the blue "Details" button
3. On the left-hand side of the screen find the words "Place Hold" and click on them
4. Under "user ID" enter the barcode from the back of your library card (just enter the numbers - don't put in spaces or dashes)
5. Enter your "PIN" and select the location where you want to pick up the item from the drop-down menu
6. Enter in an "expiration date" if you don't need the item after a certain date
7. Click the blue "Place Hold" button

Once your hold item is ready for pickup, the staff at the library will call you! Items that have a three-week loan period will be available for pickup for seven days. Items that have a one-week loan period (DVDs & express items) will be available for pickup for three days.

## Don't have your PIN?

You will need your pin to access your account online to view your checkouts, place holds on items or to renew your items (please note that DVDs, CD-ROMs, or any item with a hold placed on it by another patron, are non-renewable). If you don't know your pin, please call us at 770-382-4203 during normal business hours or stop by the library and we will gladly assist you. Please have your library card ready, as we will need your patron ID number in order to look up your account.
